Side Pocket For A Toad

Tring Brewery - Tring, Hertfordshire

Style: Hoppy Session Ale



Unmistakeable citrus and floral notes from only the best American Cascade hops balanced with a crisp dry finish make this ale a fantastic session beer.

Style: Copper Session Bitter



Copper coloured bitter with light malty character, toffee yet fruity taste and smooth hoppy finish.

Made with Pale, Crystal and Chocolate malts and hopped with Fuggles, Golding and Bobek combine to create a copper coloured, easy drinking beer. The well balanced malt and hop flavours continue to a long, refreshing and clean finish.

Haresfoot - Chesham, Buckinghamshire

Style: Session Pale Ale



Is a light, smooth, straw-coloured, quaffable pale ale (an all-rounder) generously hopped with a rich mix of English (First Gold) and Australian (Summer) hops.

Style: Session Pale Ale



Low in ABV, but full in flavour, this punchy little pale ale gives big aroma and a thirst quenching finish.

Dark golden treacle tones, hints of roast barley and beautifully hopped with a chocolaty aroma. Black, smooth, roast barely. European Bitterness Units: 18.

Style: Golden Bitter



A deep golden best Bitter with an interesting fruity aroma and a smooth but nutty body. By blending traditional English hops with their modern American cousins and the addition of Crystal Wheat Malt in the grist Reading Best is a twist of old and new.

Style: Medium, Sparkling



A cloudy premium cider bursting with apple flavour. Crafted with Discovery, Falstaff, Gala and Jonagold eating apples to create its crisp sweet finish. It is the juice of the Jonagold apple that brings a naturally cloudy appearance.

Style: Medium Dry, Sparkling



Orchard cider has a light golden, pale straw colour with a distinctly fresh apple aroma. A pleasing bitter-sweet body is finely balanced with a fresh apple flavour, leaving the palate clean and refreshed.
